Offices Open for Nomination for the 2024 Ballot

- **Moderator-elect** (one person, 3-year term) Ineligible (past four moderators): Donita Keister, Paul Mundey, David Sollenberger, Tim McElwee
- Annual Conference Program & Arrangements Committee (one person, 3-year term) Ineligible (member completing a term in 2024): Nathan Hollenberg Church of the Brethren
- Mission and Ministry Board (one person, 5-year term) from Area 4: Missouri-Arkansas, Northern Plains, Southern Plains*, Western Plains Districts not represented on MMB the past 5 years are shown in italics. *no representation for the past 10 years Church of the Brethren
- **Mission and Ministry Board** (one person, 5-year term) **from Area 5**: Idaho, Pacific Northwest, Pacific Southwest. Districts not represented on MMB the past 5 years are shown in italics. *no representation for the past 10 years
- Bethany Theological Seminary Board of Trustees Representing the Brethren Colleges (one person, 5-year term) The board requests nominees who are aware of the dramatic changes taking place in higher education, especially seminary education; or those who are aware of the issues of division in the denomination and changes in the larger church; or persons of color who can help the seminary have conversations about diversity; or persons who have corporate or executive leadership experience.
- On Earth Peace Board (one person, 5-year term) The board requests nominees who can help OEP "develop and walk with leaders and communities who work for justice and peace." To participate in the board's "values-based consensus" decision making process, each board member must complete a specialized 2.5-day training program in anti-racism, for which OEP covers costs.


